

BELLERIVE YACHT CLUB SAIL DAY 24 March 2024

The Sailing Instructions, as well as those in Section 1 of the Fixture Book, are applicable to the BYC Sail Days.

1. SCHEDULE

1.1. The Warning Signal for the first Group to start will be 13:25.

2. CREW DECLARATION

- 2.1. Crew Declaration
 - 2.1.1. For each group a boat shall submit a Crew Declaration via TOPYACHT before its warning signal.
 - 2.1.2. The Crew Declaration shall confirm that the boat intends to race and shall include required details of persons on board as follows:
 - i. Name;
 - ii. Contact phone number; and
 - iii. Australian Sailing Number in accordance with SI 2.2.
 - iv. Emergency contact name and number
 - 2.1.3. Boats that do not comply with SI 2.1.1 and SI 2.1.2 (i, ii, iii) will be scored DSQ without a hearing for the relevant race. This changes A5.1 RRS (2021-24).

3. FIRST WARNING SIGNAL TIMES & GROUP IDENTIFIERS

3.1. The Warning Signal for the first Group to start will be 13:25 with the starting signal at 13:30.

4. STARTING AREA, STARTING AND FINISHING LINES

4.1. STARTING LINE VICTORIA ESPLANADE

The starting line will be between the flagpole of the starting box and a black and white chequered inflatable buoy.

4.2. FINISHING LINE VICTORIA ESPLANADE

The finishing line will be between the flagpole on the Victoria Esplanade Box and a black and white chequered inflatable buoy laid approximately west of the Victoria Esplanade Box.

5. STARTING TIMES AND STARTING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1. Competitors may be advised of starting procedure signals on VHF Channel 14. Note: Boats should not transmit on VHF Channel 14 whilst a starting sequence is in progress except in an emergency.

6. RECALLS

6.1. Individual and General Recalls may be announced on VHF Channel 14. Failure to notify individual recalls by radio shall not be grounds for redress.

7. COURSE SIGNALS

7.1. Courses will be indicated by course boards displayed on the starting box.

8. COURSES

8.1. Fixed and laid mark courses – refer course cards.

ALL MARKS ARE TO BE ROUNDED AND LEFT TO THE SIDE SHOWN BELOW

- 01 Start \rightarrow D (Port) \rightarrow H (Starboard) \rightarrow C (Starboard) \rightarrow D (Starboard) \rightarrow Finishing line.
- 02 Start \rightarrow C (Port) \rightarrow P (Port) \rightarrow J (Port) \rightarrow Finishing line.
- 03 Start \rightarrow T (Port) \rightarrow P (Port) \rightarrow J (Port) \rightarrow Finishing line.
- Start \rightarrow P (Port) \rightarrow H (Port) \rightarrow J (Port) \rightarrow Finishing line.
- 05 Start \rightarrow B2 (Port) \rightarrow H (Port) \rightarrow J (Port) \rightarrow Finishing line.
- Start \rightarrow P (Port) \rightarrow A (Port) \rightarrow P (Port) \rightarrow Finishing Line.
- Start \rightarrow P (Port) \rightarrow A (Port) \rightarrow B2 (Port) \rightarrow Finishing Line.
- Start \rightarrow P (Port) \rightarrow A (Port) \rightarrow B1 (Port) \rightarrow Finishing Line.

9. MARKS - POSITIONS, BEARING AND DISTANCES ARE APPROXIMATE ONLY

- A Black and white chequered inflatable laid to the West Of Victoria Esplanade Box.
- B1 Yellow permanent mark 0.5 n miles SE of Kangaroo Bluff
- B2 Yellow permanent mark 1.2 nm SE of Kangaroo Bluff.
- C Yellow inflatable buoy approximately 0.5 nm E of Cartwright Point. The buoy may be moved within 0.5 nm circle from that position.
- D Orange permanent mark 0.5 n miles ENE of Wrest Point
- G Orange inflatable buoy with a black band 0.3nm E of John Garrow Light. The buoy may be moved within 0.3 nm circle from that position.
- H Orange float mark 0.25nm SW of Howrah Point.
- J Yellow mark 0.2 n miles NE of the Powder Jetty

- P Orange float mark 0.5nm SW of Punch's Reef.
- R Yellow inflatable buoy in Ralphs Bay on a line NE of Gellibrand Point. The buoy may be moved within 0.3 nm circle from that position.
- T Orange float mark 0.4nm SW of Tranmere Point.W
- W Orange inflatable mark 0.3 nm NW of Trywork Point.

10. RACE AREA AND SAFETY CATEGORIES

10.1. The BYC Sail Days will be sailed on the River Derwent and will be Category 7. In all cases AS SR Section 5, 5.01.1 (j) (on a boat without lifelines complying with 3.12, a lifejacket complying with 5.01.1(i), shall be worn by each member of the crew while on deck) shall apply.

11. HANDICAPS

- 11.1. Competitors in the BYC Sail Days will have a PHS handicap.
- 11.2. The Race Committee may provide an ORC result.
- 11.3. Boats entering ORCc must have a current, valid audited ORCc certificate or a current, valid ORC certificate.
 The Single Number Scoring Option, All Purpose (AP) Time on Time will be used for scoring.

12. PROTESTS

12.1. Protests must be lodged at BYC within one (1) hours of the last boat finishing in the race. The protest will be heard at a time determined by the Protest Committee.

13. PRIZES

- 13.1. A prize will be awarded to the winner on corrected time in each Group
- 13.2. A prize will be awarded to the overall winner on PHS corrected time.
- 13.3. Additional prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

14. TIME LIMITS

14.1. The time limit will be 17:30. Boats that have not then finished will be scored 'Did Not Finish' (DNF) without a hearing. This changes Rule 35, 63.1, A4 and A5.

15. NUMBER OF CREW

15.1. The minimum number of crew on each boat is two adults.

16. RETIREMENTS

16.1. Any boat retiring shall report the fact to the Race Committee as soon as possible.

17. RADIO INSTRUCTIONS

All competitors shall maintain a listening watch on VHF Channel 14 for announcements by the Race Committee. The Race Committee may broadcast the course to be sailed, names/sail numbers of OCS boats.
